

Getting to the Conference

Chester is a beautiful, historical city with many attractions and good transport links. Useful information about where to stay in Chester and to plan your visit can be found on the Visit Cheshire website: [Link to Visit Cheshire Website](#)

The conference venue is:

Chester Zoo

Upton-by-Chester, Chester, CH2 1EU.

To attend the conference, delegates will need to enter through the Main Zoo entrance.

Travelling by car:

There is free parking onsite at the main entrance. Additional accessible parking is available but must be booked, please email Poppy/Rebecca on awrn-manager@bristol.ac.uk

For Sat Nav, use CH2 1EU to main entrance. Follow the signs to Chester until you see the brown tourist zoo signs. Brown tourist signs from M56 Junction 14 or M53 Junction 12, or Chester City Centre. Once you get onto the A41, stay on that road until you reach a roundabout with signs for Chester Zoo. Please note: Don't turn down Flag Lane North as it's a dead end. For anyone driving an electric vehicle there are 26 car charging points with a Type 2 universal socket.



Travelling by public transport:**Airport** (Check if you need a UK Visa)

The closest airport is Liverpool John Lennon (around 1 hour 30 minutes travel by public transport to Chester Zoo) and Manchester airport is also relatively close (around 1 hour 40 minutes).

By train

Technically, the nearest train station is Bache (take bus 1 from there to the zoo), however, for most people, it will be easiest to use the direct bus links from Chester train station (bus X1 or 1).

By bus

Stagecoach buses X1 and 1 go from Chester City Centre and Liverpool City Centre direct to the zoo.

Buses are every ~15 minutes. From Chester the earliest bus arrives at the zoo at 08:23am, and the last bus leaves at 18:40.

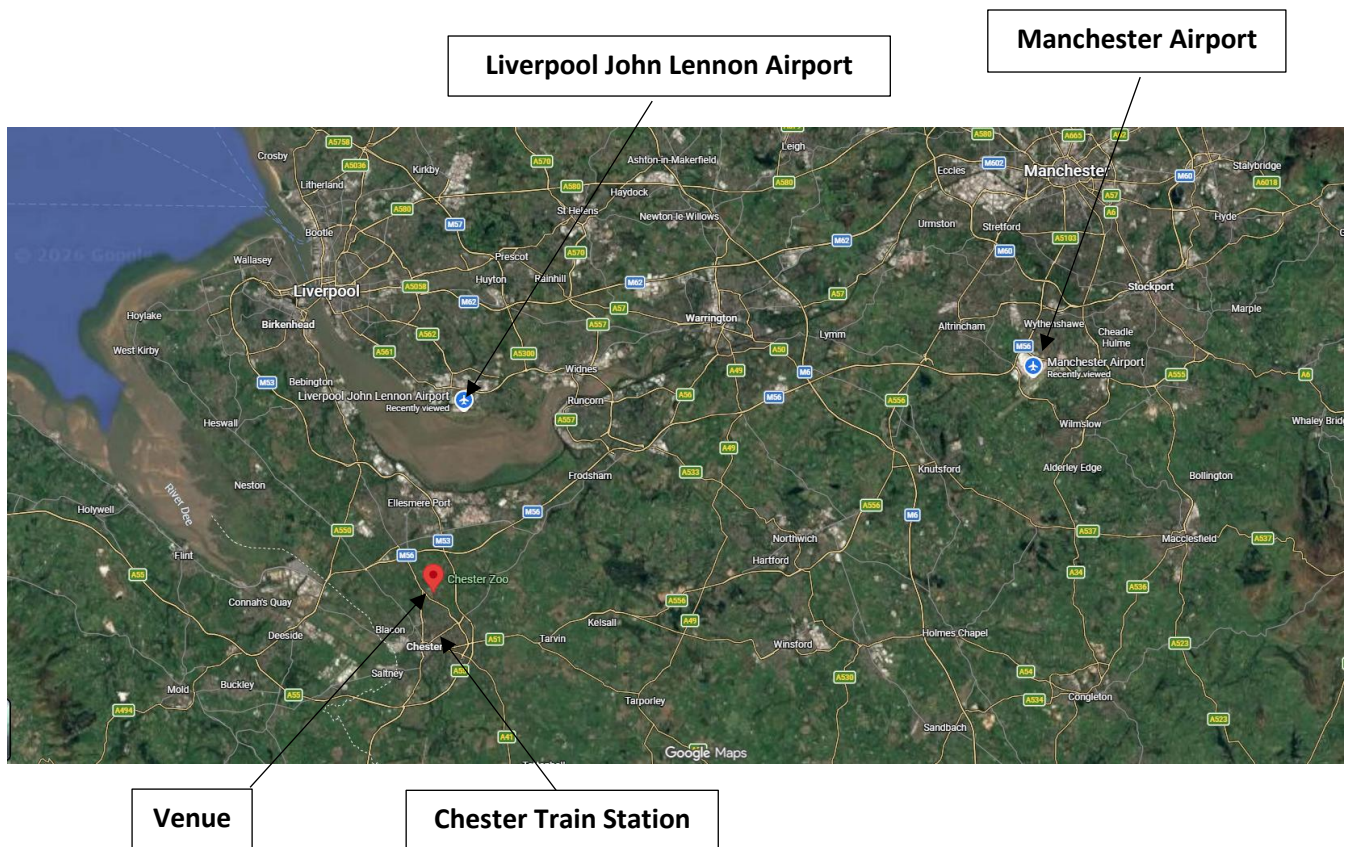
